



Fatality #7 - March 17, 2003
Powered Haulage - Surface – Kentucky
Star Fire Mining - Star Fire Mine

COAL MINE FATALITY - On Monday, March 17, 2003, a 48-year old independent contractor truck driver, with 27 years of total experience, was fatally injured at a surface coal mine. The driver was hauling a load of coal up an inclined haul road when the truck apparently stopped and began descending back down the haul road. The victim exited the cab and was run over by the truck's front wheel.



Best Practices

- Ensure that all personnel who operate mobile equipment wear their seat belts at all times and instruct them never to exit from moving vehicles.
- Conduct pre-operational checks to identify any defects that may affect the safe operation of equipment before it is placed into service.
- Maintain equipment braking and steering systems in good repair and adjustment.
- Know the truck's capabilities, operating ranges, load-limits and safety features.
- Ensure that parking brakes are engaged and the wheels are turned into the bank or berm before exiting the operator's cab.

This is the 7th fatality reported in calendar year 2003 in the coal mining industry. As of the accident date in 2002, there were 8 fatalities reported in the coal mining industry. This is the 2nd fatality classified as Powered Haulage in 2003. At this time in 2002, there were two fatalities classified as Powered Haulage.
