



Eckley Miners' Village, surrounded by black-silt ponds and strip-mining pits, is alive with the unique heritage of the anthracite region. Settled in 1854, the community remained



a privately owned company "patch" town until 1971. Now a National Register District, Eckley is home to more than fifty residents-retired miners, their widows and children. Its 58 buildings, 100 acres, furnishings and exhibits preserve the everyday life of the coal miner and his family.
