Training Update and Field Activities

Training Update

- Launched a quarterly training call:
 - Update trainers on new training developments
 - Solicit ideas and feedback from trainers
- Added a new training page on the MSHA website:
 - Provide training information and training material
 - View the training page at:

Educational Field and Small Mine Services (EFSMS)

- Educational Field Services and Small Consultation Program merged in June 2014
 - Provide a single, more efficient and consistent program to work with all sizes of mining operations
 - Additional focus to reach more small mines (10 or fewer)
 - Work more closely with industry stakeholders (state mining associations and labor organizations)

EFSMS Mine Visits

- Nearly 7,800 mine visits
- Approximately 50% were small mine operators
- EFSMS electrical trailer, 75 mine visits, and trained 2,134 miners on avoiding mine electrical hazards
- EFSMS explosion trailer, 19 mine visits, and trained 1,531 Coal miners in explosion hazards

Instructor Evaluations

- Monitored and evaluated an all-time high 953 Training Instructors

MNMM Initiatives CY2015

- 2,350 mines through 3 MNMM initiatives beginning in February, 2015
- 45% of mines visited were small mines (10 or fewer)
- Efforts are ongoing (confined spaces initiative, etc.)

Outreach

- Stakeholder Associations and Labor Organizations Outreach FY15 and FY16
- In FY15 EFSMS made contact with 140 mining stakeholders in a 42 states
- In FY16 EFSMS has been in contact with 68 mining stakeholders
- This is an ongoing outreach effort to solicit collaboration with mining stakeholders to participate in safety initiatives
- Joint training partnerships were formed
- Maine Aggregate Association provided access to member mine sites and equipment for EPD to develop safety and compliance training for the aggregate mining industry
- Working with Michigan Operating engineers to begin development of new task training programs
