Workshop Presentations

Workshops are 60 minutes in length. Presenters should either allow time for audience questions throughout the session or leave time for questions and answers at the end to encourage interactive workshops. Presenters are expected to exhibit a high level of professionalism, and to begin and end their presentations on time. There is a maximum of three presenters per panel or workshop.

All presentations should have the primary objective of providing information, education or opportunity for the attendees. Presentations should not include any overt solicitation on behalf of any individual, vendor, product, organization or commercial activity; the

conference offers exhibit booths to promote products and/or services. Presenters must submit a copy of their presentation to the program committee by the designated deadline. Presenters who have presented at previous MSHA events should reference that information in their submission. Presentations will be made available to conference attendees on the MSHA website after the event unless presenters opt out in writing.
