Medical Surveillance for Metal/Nonmetal (MNM) Miners

Why should I have medical exams?

- Many mining activities generate silica dust.
 Breathing silica dust can harm your health and increase your risk of death.
- Medical exams provide you with information to determine if your health is affected by breathing silica dust. This information can help you take appropriate action to protect your health.

What is the cost of the exam?

 There is no cost to you. Mine operators must offer medical exams to miners at no cost.

Are medical exam results shared with my mine operator?

- No, your mine operator will not receive your exam results; the results are provided only to you.
- You will receive your results within 30 days of your exam.

What's included in the medical exam?

- Review of your medical and work history
- Physical exam
- · Chest X-ray
- Lung function test

How often do I need a medical exam?

If you are hired on or after April 8, 2026, and new to the mining industry, then:

- You must be provided with a medical exam within 60 days of beginning work.
- You must be provided a follow-up medical exam within 3 years.
 - If there is evidence of pneumoconiosis or decreased lung function, miners must be provided another follow-up medical exam within 2 years.
- After the follow-up medical exams, you must be provided medical exams at least once every 5 years.

If you have worked in the mining industry, then:

- You must be provided a medical exam during the 12 months beginning April 8, 2026.
- You must be provided a follow-up exam every 5 years after the first medical exam.
